

The Larger Toyama Core Partner City Region (Toyama Area) is home to the mysterious Toyama Bay, known for its firefly squid and broad velvet shrimp, as well as the Toyama Plain, which stretches out around the Bay, and the majestic peaks of the Tateyama Mountain Range.

From the sea, to the city center, to the mountain peaks—some rising as high as 3,000 meters—there are plenty of sights and activities in this pamphlet exist only in this area. This pamphlet shows the reader the fine sightseeing spots in this area (Toyama City, Namerikawa City, Funahashi Village, Kamiichi Town, Tateyama Town) broken down into the three categories of tradition, history and nature, and gives an overview of sightseeing packages in these three categories.

### ore Partner City Spanning from the Sea to the Mountains

oyama has much to offer visitors: from the city center, the epitome of a compact city, ind Iwase, the lasting legacy of an ancient Japanese shipping route, to the refined legance of Yatsuo with its Owara Kaze no Bon festival, to Kureha, the home of the alass City Toyama, to the outdoor adventures in the foothills of Mt. Tateyama.

### City of Firefly Squid and Deep Sea Water

amerikawa City faces Toyama Bay and is famous for its bountiful firefly squid (hotaruika) atch. A number of attractions in the city allow the visitor to observe these delightful arine creatures, such as the Firefly Squid Boat Tour and the Hotaruika Museum. In ddition, there is a place where you can purchase deep sea water from the bay.

### The Smallest Village in Japan with Lotus and Cherry Blossoms

summer, lotus blossoms bloom in lotus fields at the gates of temples of this small llage. There is also a row of cherry trees that stretch for a kilometer along the yonotsubo River, making this spot quite lively in spring with the blooming of the herry blossoms.

### Iome to Mt. Tsurugi, the Dream of Every Mountain Hiker

Here visitors will find Mt. Tsurugi, which has been considered sacred since ancient times, as well as temples and parks situated in lush natural surroundings with holy water said to help cure all kinds of illnesses. There are also many opportunities to use this natural bounty to enjoy forest therapy and trekking.

### Key Tourist Spot on the Tateyama Alpine Route

Among the more popular sightseeing locations for visitors from abroad are the impressive and dynamic huge walls of snow, Midagahara wetlands, listed in the Ramsar Convention, and Kurobe Dam, which served as a movie location.

### What is the Larger Toyama Core Partner City Region?


In January 2018, Toyama City signed a partnership agreement to form the Larger Toyama Core Partner City Region with the municipalities of Namerikawa City, Funahashi Village, Kamiichi Town, and Tateyama Town. This agreement forms a partnership between Toyama City and four surrounding municipalities to sustain the region's population and economy so that the area residents can live with more comfortably and with peace of mind as Japanese society faces an impending reduction in population, a declining birthrate, and increasing median age. This pamphlet will showcase lovely tour routes and hands-on programs that make use of the tourism resources of the Toyama Area to help promote long-stay tourism.

This course offers experiences especially characteristic of the Toyama Area, such as washing away your worries with waterfall meditation as well as creating your own keepsakes with glassblowing and pottery. Why not bring home a real piece of Japan?



The Toyama Glass Studio, which is home to local artisanal glassmakers, offers glass blowing sessions and paper-weight making. Even beginners will feel comfortable trying glassblowing under the careful instructions of their artisanal glassmakers. (85 Nishikanaya, Toyama 2076-436-3322/Reservations)



Etchu-Yatsuo Japanese paper is a durable, yet beautiful material that was formerly used to make medicine bags in Toyama. At the Keijusha studio, visitors will have the opportunity to make a one-of-a-kind sheet of Japanese paper using ancient paper-making technaiques. Waterfall meditation here is famous for the cold-water ascetic practices in the coldest days of winter and for the waterfall opening ceremony in the summer. Visitors can borrow white ceremonial robes at the temple to try waterfall meditation. Visitors may also calm their minds as they trace the image of Acala (Fudo Myo-o), a designated important cultural property of Japan. (163 Oiwa, Kamiichi-machi 20076-472-2301)

### 4 **Etchu Pottery Center Tonokan**



Here visitors can experience Etchu Seto-yaki ceramics with Tateyama traditional techniques. Using either Etchu Seto clay, sourced from the Seto district where the techniques originated, or Shigaraki clay, visitors can make a dish, mug, or teacup.

### Tovama Glass Art Museum



This museum serves as the launching point for the glass culture and art designed by the Japanese architect Kengo Kuma, Visitors will encounter the spatial art of the contemporary glass artist Dale Chihuly, as well as other numerous outstanding glass works from both Japan and abroad. The ancient Japanese hemlock trees (designated Natural Monument by the prefecture) lining the approach to the temple gates have become famous in recent years among those seeking "forest





# Historical Exploration Package

The Tateyama Mountain Range—the very symbol of the Tateyama folk belief. This region is filled with places that transcend time and space, including museums that unlock the history of the area, a theme park that lets visitors experience the hell and paradise of Shinto and Buddhist lore, and the shipping agent houses that remain as the legacy of the prosperous ancient shipping routes. This museum is housed within the tower of Toyama Castle. Visitors can learn of the 400-plus-year history of Toyama Castle through a variety of displays, including documents, models and videos. The 140 cm helmet said to have been worn by Toshinaga Maeda is also a must-see. (1-62 Honmaru, Toyama **2**076-432-7911)





This sightseeing cruise passes under seven bridges that span the Matsukawa River, giving visitors wonderful scenery throughout the four seasons. The 500 cherry-blossom-tree tunnel in spring, the dazzling greenery of summer, and the blazing colors of autumn are certain to spellbind visitors at any time throughout the year.

This residence was once owned by the Baba family whose patriarch was a successful trader ship proprietor in the shipping agency for Kitamae-bune ships during the 19th century. This house exhibits some distinctive features of the time, such as the 30 m-long earthen floor hallway and the huge 33 tatami-mat room.

# Muryo-ji Temple Takeuchi Tenjindo Ancient Tomb



Muryo-ji Temple, founded during the Kamakura period (1185-1333), is popular for the lotus blossoms best seen during the Obon period in early- to mid-August. Visitors can also see the 38.4 meter-long tomb, said to be built by a despotic king during the early Kofun period (300-538). This museum displays a wide variety of outstanding artworks from its collection, including pottery and porcelain works created in regions along the Silk Road, Buddhist images and Christian icons, as well as works of the mandala artist, Josaku Maeda. It also holds special or themed exhibitions, in addition to its regular displays.

### 6 Tateyama Museum of Toyama Mandala Yuen Park



This is a theme park that offers three-dimensional representations of the world of Tateyama Mandalas. It's comprised of four areas in total, including Chi-kai (hell), hi-no-michi (path to Mt. Tateyama's peak), and Ten-kai (heaven). Anyone can experience hell, paradise, and re-birth. It's really stimulating!

Toyama City Tourist Information Center

### Shusui Museum of Art



This museum houses a collection, mainly focusing on paintings and crafts from the 12th century onwards. Its highlights include a National Important Cultural Property, The Statke Book of The Thirty-Six Immortal Poets by Shigeyuki Minamoto; works of prominent artists of modern Japanese painting; and swords made by swordmakers from Etchu Province.

### Nunobashi Bridge



Women were forbidden from climbing Mt. Tateyama during the Edo period (1603-1868), so the Nunobashi Kanjoe ceremony was held on Nunobashi Bridge serving as the border between this world and the next so that women could be reborn in the Buddhist paradise. This ceremony is listed with UNESCO Japan as a property for the future.







Sourced from the Tateyama mountain range, this four-tiered waterfall has the highest drop in Japan at 350 meters. The Hannoki Falls are also a sight to behold when they appear to the right of the main falls after the snow melt in the spring or a heavy rain.

### (4) **HOTARUIKA Museum**

### Healthian-wood The Workshop



At The Workshop, essential oils and aromatic distilled water are extracted from the many herbs grown and harvested in its garden. Visitors leave Namerikawa fishing port on a sightseeing craft before dawn to observe the firefly squid fishing with set nets. ### Anantan Sacred Site



After climbing down a number of stone steps, you will reach the hall where an image of Yakushinyorai (Bhaisajyaguru) stands with a natural water spring behind it. This water has long been believed nationwide as holy water that can help cure all kinds of illnesses. It has also been selected as one of Japan's 100 remarkable waters by the Ministry of the Environment.

### Fugan Suijo Line



This is a canal cruise that links the Fugan Canal Kansui Park with the port town of Iwase, and along the route, you can experience the "water elevator" at the Nakajima Komon gate. The canal uses a lock system to raise and lower the water level, lifting boats 2.5 meters above sea level at the canal's main elevation point. 




